

BECOME A STLCOP PRECEPTOR

As a St. Louis College of Pharmacy preceptor, you will be helping shape our profession's future by training the next generation of pharmacists. Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPEs) are three weeks in length and occur in community or health system settings during the summer. Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPEs) are five weeks in length and occur in all settings throughout the year.



WHY PRECEPT?

- Access to online library resources
- Free preceptor and pharmacist development programming and continuing education opportunities
- Adjunct academic title with opportunities for promotion
- Integration of students into workflow to assist with workload and provide additional patient care interventions
- Recruitment potential for interns, residents or new graduates

PRECEPTOR CRITERIA

- Have professional training, experience and competence
- Provide high-quality, evidence-based, patient-centered care and accept responsibility for patient outcomes
- Practice ethically and be in good standing with the state's Board of Pharmacy
- Licensed for more than 12 months prior to taking students

STLCOP PRECEPTORS

- Relate to students as individuals
- Provide positive and constructive feedback
- Are enthusiastic, accessible and organized
- Serve as role models
- Display a positive attitude
- Are supportive and respectful of colleagues, students and patients
- Reflect on experience to identify ways to improve future precepting



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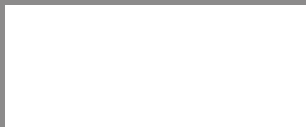
