Emergency Operations Plan

The College maintains an institutional Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) to guide our emergency response and facilitate a quick recovery from incidents. The EOP adopts an all-hazards approach and integrates with plans from our neighboring institutions and first responders for effective and



efficient emergency management within the medical complex. It is frequently tested and evaluated for improvement opportunities.

Campus Safety Escorts

St. Louis College of Pharmacy is dedicated to providing a safe learning and work environment for all students, faculty, staff and visitors. We provide health and safety escorts to members of the campus community. Escorts are provided to or from a person's residence, vehicle or other mode of transportation within a three-mile radius of campus from 6 p.m.-1 a.m.

Access Control

During business hours, the College (excluding certain facilities) is open to students, parents, employees and guests. During non-business hours, facilities are accessed using a College ID or by contacting the Office of Public Safety. Some campus facilities may have individual hours, which may vary at different times of the year. Facilities schedules are developed by individual departments. Emergencies, campus closures and special events may necessitate changes or alterations to schedules.

Vehicle Lockouts and Jump Starts

The Office of Public Safety is equipped with a vehicle unlocking kit. If you have locked your keys in your vehicle, call the Office of Public Safety, and provide the vehicle location, make, model and color. An officer will respond and attempt to unlock your vehicle. You must provide a photo ID to verify ownership of the vehicle and complete a release of liability form before the officer can attempt to unlock your car.

We can also help you jump start your vehicle. Drivers needing jump starts should raise the hood of their vehicle to help identify their location. Also, the driver of the vehicle needing a jump start must have a valid driver's license or their College ID. You will be required to sign a form permitting the jump start. There is no cost for this service.

On- and Off-Campus Safety

Know the emergency phone numbers for campus and the St. Louis area. Ensure that you are subscribed to the campus emergency notification system. Plan your safest route to your destination, choosing well-lit, busy pathways and streets, and avoiding high crime areas. Be aware of your surroundings, walk with confidence and keep your head up! Carry a whistle.

Residence Hall or Off-Campus Living

Get to know your resident assistant, residence life staff and neighbors. Always lock your rooms and windows at night. Report any suspicious person or behavior. Report any malfunctioning locks, doors, windows or lighting. Report all thefts to the Office of Public Safety or residence life staff.

Parking at the College

Children's Place Garage

The Children's Place Garage is located at 4531 Children's Place, St. Louis, MO 63110-1088. During normal parking hours (Monday-Friday, 7 a.m.-3 p.m.), only those drivers who select the Children's Place Garage will be able to access parking. Drivers will swipe their College ID and park in any available spot, with the exception of designated parking for visitors, Mortar and Pestle Society members and people with disabilities.

Duncan Central Garage

The Duncan Central Garage is located at 4456 Duncan Ave., St. Louis, MO 63110-1088 (between Taylor and Newstead avenues). Drivers should enter through the east entrance, closest to Newstead Avenue. The west entrance is dedicated to the Rehabilitation Institute of St. Louis' patients and visitors. After swiping their access card, drivers may enter the garage and park.
